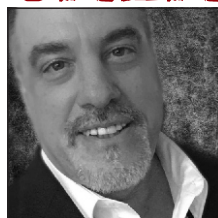
Come enjoy the four winning scripts from the 2019 GREENBERG PLAYWRIGHT COMPETITION of regional, original, one-act plays.
